

Colonials suffer first loss, 22-14

WATERLOO - The Glove Cities Colonials came up on the short end of the 22-14 score Saturday night against the Finger Lakes Impact.

The Impact (2-2) capitalized on four interceptions, one of which was returned for a touchdown, and held off a second-half surge by the Colonials (5-1) to claim the NAFL victory.

The Colonials' scores came on a 31-yard touchdown pass from Justin Kastner to Brian Baldwin. They also hooked up for the 2-point conversion. Brandon Insognia accounted for Glove Cities' other score, gathering in a fumble and returning it 20 yards for the touchdown. The 2-point conversion attempt failed.

"We played flat tonight," Colonials' coach Matt Capano said.

The Colonials travel to Albany to take on the Metro Mallers next Saturday with kick off set for 7:30 p.m.
